At the end of the first day, only 8 races were completed in each boat. Winds began from the east, then migrated to the northeast, southeast, west, north, and then back to the east. Race committee, spectators, and sailors were equally frustrated by the fickleness of the wind, exacerbated by an extremely strong tidal current due the fall harvest lunar tides.
